3.	We are using underground tanks provided by the oil companies and it was not calibrated during the stocks calculation or reanalysis time we are not able to make sure of the inventory. The issues are just an extension of the above explained lacuna and we are forced to operate the retail outlets for financial loss. The corrective action of calibration of underground tanks by the W&M Legal Metrology department and Ensuring the maintenance of it, the standards laid out by the OISD and Quality Control on the underground storage tanks need to
